

MONDAY

1. Pharaoh increased the Israelites' workload after Moses asked him to let the people go to celebrate a feast to the Lord. God then manifested His power and His mighty hand to deliver the people of Israel. Egypt represents the world, and Pharaoh represents Satan, the prince of this world. The world does not want us to have time to serve the Lord, so it seeks to occupy all our time (Exodus 6:1).

2. The Lord revealed Himself to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob as God Almighty (El Shaddai), to fulfill the promise of bringing forth a descendant who would inherit the land, and because of this, they received from Him everything they needed. Abraham tried to use his natural skills to help God, but he failed. God showed that He does not need man's help to fulfill His will. He is God Almighty: it is enough to walk in His presence, listen attentively to His word, and follow what He commands (Genesis 17:1-2).

3. When Jacob went down to Egypt with his family, there were seventy people; two hundred and fifteen years later, they grew to more than two million. The Almighty God (El Shaddai) fulfilled His promise and made them a great nation. God sent Moses to lead them out of Egypt so that they might serve the Lord and presented Himself to him as YHWH, the unpronounceable name of God. This name was already known, but only then did God reveal its meaning: our God is "I AM" (Genesis 4:26; Exodus 3:13-14; 6:2-3).

4. "No one had told Jacob anything about the house of God, but the Lord gave him this revelation (Genesis 28:16-17). Therefore, if we want to walk in God's way, we need Him to appear to us and give us the revelation of Christ as the One who restored the connection between man and God." (Daily Food, book 12, week 1, Monday, p. 6).

TUESDAY

1. God allowed Moses to acquire all the wisdom of the Egyptians, making him powerful in words and deeds. At forty years old, he considered himself capable of liberating the people, but God sent him to the desert to tend sheep. At eighty years old, when he no longer considered himself capable, God called him. To fulfill His promises, God leads man to his end. When we think we are good for nothing, He presents Himself as the "I AM" and takes command (Exodus 3:1-2, 14; Acts 7:23, 30).

2. As the LORD (YHWH), He is the very "I AM", the Self-Existent One, who exists from eternity to eternity. He is the origin of the existence of all things: everything was created through Him and for Him, and everything that exists depends on Him to continue to exist. The mystery of God's will is to make Christ the Head over all things, because He desires to be the "I AM" in everything (Exodus 3:14; John 8:23-24; Ephesians 1:9-10; Colossians 1:16-17).

3. To believe in the "I AM" is to believe in the work of the cross. With the end of the self, through the death and resurrection of Christ, we allow the "I AM" to take the reins of our lives. This is the meaning of the change from El Shaddai to the "I AM" (YHWH). The "I AM" fulfills God's promises made to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. He executes His work through His word and fulfills all His promises. Everything God says is miraculously fulfilled without delay (John 8:28; Hebrews 11:13; Ezekiel 12:22-28).

4. "Today the Lord calls us to love and cherish our birthright, to love and cherish His word. In this way, He will surely bless us, make us pillars in His house, that is, He will cause us to assume responsibilities in the church." (Daily Food, book 12, week 1, Tuesday, p. 7).

WEDNESDAY

1. God is a God who speaks; His word is fulfilled and accomplishes His will. Everything He has spoken to the church is fulfilled and has been accomplished to carry out His will in our days. He has found people who truly listen to the word attentively and put it into practice in their own lives. We have little strength and lack the capacity, but God Himself has the power to fulfill what He says (Ezekiel 12:28; Revelation 3:8).

2. God has spoken many times and in many ways. In the Old Testament, He fulfilled His promise through the word proclaimed by the prophets. Today, in the church age, He speaks to us through the Son, whom He appointed heir of all things and through whom He made the universe. The universe was formed by the word of God, and in the same way, today He accomplishes His work through the Word. Creation is the work of the "I AM" for the fulfillment of His purpose (Hebrews 1:1-2; 11:3).

3. The "I AM" affirmed that He would fulfill the promise made to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob to give the children of Israel the land of Canaan, where they lived as sojourners. For this to happen, Moses, as God's instrument, only needed to act according to what God told him. If God spoke, He will surely fulfill His word. Even though it is difficult to believe, we need to learn to believe in the "I AM", who has the power to fulfill all that He promises (Exodus 6:4-8).

4. "Thank God, the solution is in Christ! He crucified our old self with Him and in resurrection gave us a new life! God wants to make us a new man in Christ, but for this replacement to occur, death and resurrection are necessary. Today, through the word, God transforms this old man corrupted by sin (Ephesians 5:26)." (Daily Food, book 12, week 1, Wednesday, p. 11)

THURSDAY

1. With the fall and disobedience in the Garden of Eden, sin and death entered the world. Since then, the world has been ruled by the prince of this world, represented by Pharaoh. At first glance, it seemed that God had lost man, but the Lord strives to rescue man from the world so that he may serve Him, just as He struggled to liberate the people of Israel (Genesis 3:6; Exodus 5:1-2; Romans 5:12).

2. Humanity follows the course of this world, a system created by Satan that dominates politics, economics, religion, and culture to oppose God's authority. The world seeks to keep people away from God, consuming all their time, money, and energy. Its goal is to frustrate God's will, but we are here to live out the fulfillment of His promises and do His will (Ephesians 2:1-2).

3. Satan, through his system, seeks to break all ties between humanity and God, and this situation will worsen as the end times approach. We need to leave this world to serve the Lord. The gospel of the kingdom exists precisely to liberate God's people from this bondage, so that man may be under the authority of Christ, serve God, and do His will (2 Corinthians 4:4; Psalm 2:1-3; Ephesians 6:12).

4. "God desires to transform our nature through the continuous flow of the word that comes from His mouth. He supplies us with this ever-new word, like the flow of a river of living water, which flows into eternity, for the purpose of carrying out God's will. The flow of the word inoculates us with the divine elements." (Daily Food, book 12, week 1, Thursday, p. 12)

FRIDAY

1. In Revelation, John had a vision in which he ascended to heaven shortly after the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus. He saw a throne, and someone was seated on it. God is on the throne. There is a dispute between God, who governs the universe, and Satan, who desires to rule the Earth. However, it is not Satan who is on the throne, but the "I AM" (Revelation 4:1-3; Zechariah 4:6, 10; Revelation 5:6).

2. From the throne, God commands all things. When we hear the word and put it into practice, the seven Spirits of God work to fulfill His promises. After the resurrection, Jesus commissioned the disciples to preach the gospel to every creature, and this is also our mission. As we fulfill this commission, the Lord cooperates with us, and the Spirit works freely, confirming the word through signs and wonders (Revelation 4:5; Mark 16:15, 19-20; Galatians 3:5).

3. The Lamb has power! His seven Spirits and His seven eyes roam throughout the earth, observing every situation and carrying out God's work to fulfill His promise. Wherever missionaries are sent, the seven Spirits of God and the seven eyes of the Lamb are already present, ready to do God's work. Believing in the commanding voice and allowing the "I AM" to execute His work with power depends only on us (Zechariah 3:9; 4:6-10; Revelation 5:1-6).

4. "We need to renew our minds to understand what the Lord is doing today through teenagers, who are renewing the church life with the energy of God's life. Let us love the tools the Lord has given us, such as war cries and immersion in the Word. Let us not cling to past experiences, looking only at the form. Let us seek to understand the essence and see what God is doing in our time." (Daily Food, book 12, week 1, Friday, page 15).

SATURDAY

1. The gospel of the kingdom needs to be preached throughout the world so that God's will may be done. Famines and wars have been happening since the gospel was proclaimed, but this is not yet the end. Only when the gospel of the kingdom has been preached throughout the Earth will the end come. This is our mission: to take and conquer the Earth so that the Lord may fulfill His promises and His will may be done (Matthew 24:3, 6-8, 14).

2. For God's promises to be fulfilled, the "I AM" must take command. If we believe in the word and put it into practice, He gains freedom to fulfill His will through His seven Spirits. We no longer live for the old self, for we were baptized into Christ's death and buried in the likeness of His death, so that today we no longer live according to the old self, but according to the "I AM", in newness of life (Romans 6:5-6; Galatians 2:20).

3. Let us allow the "I AM" to live within us to do His will. Following Jesus means surrendering the direction of our lives to the Lord and letting Him take command of our being, for our old self has already been crucified. The cross is not only suffering, but the means by which the old self is brought to death, so that we may heed the command and cooperate in the fulfillment of His word. Whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever denies themselves and does not love this world will have their soul saved and transformed (Matthew 16:24-25; 1 John 2:15-17).

4. "Thanks to the Lord, through the resurrection of Christ, we have been set free (1 Peter 1:3-5). The new birth has given us a living hope; we are no longer slaves to the old man, the natural man, to sin and death. Through the resurrection of Christ, we have received new life to an incorruptible, undefiled, unfading inheritance, reserved in heaven for us!" (Daily Food, book 12, week 1, Saturday, p. 17)

SUNDAY

1. Korah, Dathan, Abiram, and two hundred and fifty leaders of the congregation rebelled against Moses and Aaron, accusing them of exalting themselves above the Lord's congregation. God was angry at this rebellion, but Korah's sons did not follow their father's path. They remained clean and were used by the Lord as priests. Even if there are problems in our family, we must remain clean and be instruments in the Lord's hands (Numbers 16:1-3; 26:9-11; 2 Chronicles 20:19).

2. The genealogy in Exodus 6 does not focus on Jacob's twelve sons, but aims to legitimize Moses as the Lord's envoy and Aaron as his spokesman. This confers authority and credibility upon them before the people, showing that they were faithful servants sent by God to lead Israel out of Egypt. In serving the Lord, we do not seek protagonism or exaltation, for the word is the true protagonist. The Lord honors and uses those who serve Him faithfully to fulfill His will (Exodus 6:14-27).

3. For those who work in the Lord's work and follow the commanding voice, the seven Spirits of God cooperate and accompany them. We are mortal and incapable on our own, but through God's word received by the church as the hearing of faith, the seven Spirits come forth from the throne and accomplish His work. In sending us, the Lord grants us honor, authority, and the cooperation of His seven Spirits (Revelation 4:5; 5:6; Galatians 3:2).

4. "Therefore, He works in us a profound transformation—not so that we may be trophies for display in the New Jerusalem, but for the edification of the church, Bethel, the house of God. As the members of the Body undergo transformation, edification becomes possible, not only in appearance, but in reality." (Daily Food, book 12, week 1, Sunday, p. 19).
