

## MONDAY

1. There is a river flowing from Eden, originating from the tree of life, which represents the only begotten Son of God. This river gives man access to God and bestows upon him the responsibility and mission of subduing the whole Earth. We were not created with great capacity; however, we were given a magnificent organ: the human spirit (Genesis 2:7, 9).

2. Our spirit is meant to contain Almighty God. Through it, we have access to the tree of life, to have fellowship with God and fulfill His will on Earth. The river of life and the tree of life are not static, but accompany us at all times in life; they are streams of living water. This stream of water is the Word (Revelation 22:1-2).

3. Today, God desires not only to dwell in our spirit, but in our whole heart, not merely as a guest, but as the owner. This is accomplished through the Word; it is not far from us, but within us; all we need to do is believe—believe in the Word of the gospel, in the Word of faith (Romans 10:8-9).

4. “If it has been some time since your heart burned with the Word of the Lord, it is time to seek it again. We can pray: ‘Lord, speak to me. I do not want to hear the messages superficially; I want to hear Your voice, and for my heart to burn again for You.’ Therefore, nothing should be done mechanically” (Psalm 39:3) (Daily Food, Book 9, Week 1, Monday, p. 7).

## TUESDAY

1. When you confess, with your heart, that Jesus Christ is Lord, you are saved and receive eternal life. But He does not want to be just a guest within you; He wants to fully occupy your soul. Therefore, invite Christ to dwell in you. Let Him be the Lord of your life, governing your mind, your will, and your emotions (Romans 10:10; Ephesians 3:17).

2. Being free in our thoughts is not simply about thinking what we want, but about having our minds aligned with God’s will. Only then will we fulfill His will: to rule the whole Earth. Many Christians have God only as a guest in their hearts, but we need to allow Him to dwell within us, ruling our entire being (Ephesians 3:17-19).

3. When we allow God to govern us, our decisions are headed up by Christ. Do you allow the living water to wash and sanctify your whole being, removing what is not of God and adding elements of life through the living Word—through immersion, transcription, and war cries? We are channels of living water (Ephesians 5:26).

4. “Hearing the voice of the Lord makes our hearts burn and leads us to serve Him in a living, not automatic, way. [Thus] the life of God in us grows; and [...] love also grows, for God is love. When we grow in life, we have a solid foundation of love on which to begin building ourselves up with our brothers and sisters” (1 John 4:8-11) (Daily Food, Book 9, Week 1, Tuesday, p. 8).

## WEDNESDAY

1. When living water flows through our soul, we need to transmit it to others, for we are channels of the living God. As it washes over us, divine love is added to us. As we allow this washing, a foundation of love is formed. God desires not only maturity, but true spiritual edification (Colossians 3:14).

2. We are all different from one another and tend to relate to people similar to ourselves, as it is easier and more pleasant. However, the foundation of love needs to be strengthened. When we serve the Lord, He places us with people different from ourselves. Since only divine love can unite us, the true edification of the Church, the house of God, will occur (Romans 5:8; 1 Corinthians 13:4-8a).

3. How have you been serving the Lord, in your own way or by the flow of the river of living water? When we serve the Lord, not according to our own will, but according to this flow, divine love becomes a bond between us. Thus, we come to have one vision and one feeling, and the work of God will be accomplished on Earth (Matthew 5:25-26).

4. “God desires to find in us today a detached, clean heart, totally surrendered to the Lord. Like Abraham, we are called to live as pilgrims, seeking a heavenly homeland, so that God may fully accomplish His will through us” (Hebrews 11:8-9) (Daily Food, Book 9, Week 1, Wednesday, p. 12).

## THURSDAY

1. Tamar recognized the importance of lineage, and this influenced Judah to value the birthright. After that, he assumed responsibility and accepted risks. Because of this, Christ was begotten, went to the cross, and died for us. Today He lives in us, and we can carry out His work and fulfill His will (Genesis 38:26; 44:33-34).

2. We need to defend the Kingdom of God on Earth. Through Joseph, life was preserved by meeting physical needs; through Judah, in the face of pressure and the responsibility of defending his family, the need for leadership in favor of the Kingdom of God became evident. Thus, Christ came as the fulfillment of the promise made to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (Genesis 12:2-3; 45:5; Romans 9:7-8).

3. God chooses people who care for lives, just as David cared for sheep. Leaders need to be willing to care for people, suffer for them, and attend to each one in their particular way. It is not just about taking a position, but about caring with love and integrity of heart (Psalm 78:70-72).

4. “In the cave of Machpelah, Abraham and Sarah were buried (Genesis 25:7-10; 23:19), then Isaac (35:27-29), Jacob (49:29-33; 50:13), and the bones of Joseph were also to be taken there (50:24-26). This place became a lasting testament to faith, obedience, and selflessness. Abraham did not accept burying his family members as a favor. He paid the price. This principle should remain with us today” (Daily Food, Book 9, Week 1, Thursday, p. 14).

## FRIDAY

1. When we take the risk of going out into the streets to preach the gospel, the Lord grants us authority. We need to go forth into all the Earth to win people, even if, in some places, this seems difficult. It is necessary to take this risk, for the authority that God gives subdues principalities and powers. Let us tread upon the whole Earth! (Matthew. 28:18; Romans 13:1).

2. How important it is, in difficult times, to take risks for God's work and assume leadership! Not through our own ability or natural strength, but through the power of the Word. It is necessary to have courage when we receive direction from God and put into practice the Word we have heard (James 1:22; Matthew 7:24).

3. By taking responsibility and risking his life, Judah produced offspring who brought about Christ. How important is the birthright! Do not despise it, do not trade it for anything. Value it. When you value it, you take responsibility for God's interests and thus cooperate in the advancement of His work (Matthew 1:1-3; Genesis 25:31; Psalm 89:27).

4. "It is not about listening to messages mechanically, but about hearing the living voice of God. The Word of God is living and effective (Hebrews 4:12). If you want to be blessed in all your life, remember the Spirit. The path to blessing is to listen with faith to God's words and live by the Spirit" (Daily Food, Book 9, Week 1, Friday, p. 16).

## SATURDAY

1. When we take responsibility for God's things, criticism may arise. But if it has been delegated by the Lord, He will defend it. When we do not take responsibility, we become negligent, and the work does not advance. Therefore, do not hide! Follow the Spirit's guidance, and He will take care of you. He is the Lion of the Tribe of Judah (Colossians 3:23-24; Revelation 5:5).

2. Let us be steadfast in the things of the Lord. Joseph is an example of responsibility and divine wisdom—wherever he went, everything was entrusted to him. Likewise, we need to be responsible and wise in the things of God. The Lord calls us to carry out His work because He needs each one of us. What will your attitude be toward the Lord's call? Are you willing to fight for the Kingdom? (Genesis 41:38-39; 44:18).

3. God's way of working is superior to ours. Man greatly values his own tactics, strategies, and natural skills, but God's ways and thoughts are infinitely higher. Let us follow the living water, walk in God's wisdom, and allow Him to build up His house. Let us be faithful (Isaiah 55:8-9).

4. "The Word comes like living water that flows, washing away and removing all impurities. It removes not only sins, but all unholy nature, the nature of the old man, of the old creation. The Word washes us and also deposits in us the holy nature of God. Thus, little by little, we are prepared as a glorious church" (Ephesians 5:27) (Daily Food, Book 9, Week 1, Saturday, p. 18).

## SUNDAY

1. God needs faithful stewards today, who do not trust in their own thoughts or ways, but in the living water that flows among us. Let us trust in the living Word that the Lord speaks to us each week, each day. It is up to us to diligently listen to the Lord's voice, to be simple in applying and practicing it. It works effectively in those who believe (Hebrews 3:5).

2. We should not live according to our own devices or in our own way, but trust in God, for He will give us the best. He works in all things for His Kingdom, in order to fulfill His will. When we understand this, we begin to do things according to His will and in His way spontaneously, because we allow ourselves to be guided by the flow of the water of life. In this way, we live in peace (Genesis 45:25-26; Psalm 125:1; Philippians 4:6-7).

3. Today we are learning to live by the flow of the Spirit and to serve in rest, for the presence of the Lord is with us. If we still insist on doing everything our way, we will grow weary, and the effort will be worthless. When we work in the flow of living water, it is the Word in which we believe that works effectively (Exodus 33:14; Hebrews 4:8-10).

4. "When someone walks in the presence of the Lord, He guides everything clearly. [...]"But he said to me, 'The Lord, before whom I walk, will send His angel with you and prosper your way...'" (Genesis 24:40). Walking in the presence of the Lord brings security, direction, and the certainty that He will bring everything to a successful conclusion" (Daily Food, Book 9, Week 1, Sunday, p. 21).
